

It takes about 20 minutes to walk from Central Station to the University Library This walk is through the city centre which is often busy, but also takes you through the beautiful city centre of Dam Square.



Once you've arrived at the University Library the conference will be in four different rooms.


Two are on the ground floor and two on the first floor.


The canteen and the room in which the breaks will take place is room B.
